

**ASSOCIATE OF
GENERAL STUDIES DEGREE**

60 Credits

The Associate of General Studies (AGS) degree is designed for students who, while seeking advanced learning in a broad variety of disciplines, do not wish to concentrate in any one particular field of learning. The numerous elective credits provide students with an excellent opportunity to pursue learning in traditional disciplines or occupational programs.

The following courses may be used to meet the distribution requirements noted on degree sheets. No one course may be used to meet two or more of the distribution requirements. Only courses numbered 100 or above may be used. Students wishing to complete an AGS degree must consult with an academic advisor or counselor and receive written approval of their program from the Associate Vice President for Curriculum and Scheduling at least one semester prior to graduation.
