

10. Not have any grades of "D" in the major occupational area for the Associate of Applied Science Degree.
11. If a student is earning two degrees subsequently or simultaneously he or she must satisfy the following dual degree policy requirements:
 - a. File a separate Application for Graduation and pay the application for graduation fee for each degree.
 - b. Complete the curricula requirements for each degree.
 - c. Complete fifteen credits in residence beyond the requirements for the first degree. This means a student must have a minimum of seventy-five (75) semester credits, 30 of which were earned in residence at the Community College of Southern Nevada. **Eg: student graduates with Associate of Arts degree requiring 60 credits in Fall 2000; seeks second degree in December 2001, student must complete at least 15 additional credits at CCSN (in residence) since the completeness of the first degree.**
 - d. A course may be used only once to fulfill each certificate or degree requirements.
12. Students transferring credits completed at other institutions toward their Community College of Southern Nevada degree or certificate must have their transcripts evaluated prior to applying for graduation.
13. Any student who fails to meet graduation requirements in any given semester must file a new application with the Office of Admissions and Records.
14. Students may apply for and receive diplomas for one of three graduation dates: August, December, or May.

Application for Graduation

The Community College of Southern Nevada awards the following degrees in various academic disciplines upon successful completion of all requirements: Associate of Business, Associate of Science, Associate of Applied Science, Associate of Arts, and Associate of General Studies. Various emphases are available in each of these degrees. The graduate's diploma and transcript will indicate the degree and emphasis.

Commencement exercises are held once a year, in May. Students who graduated during the August or December time period will be listed in the program and are eligible to participate in the Spring commencement. Students will be notified of Commencement during the Spring semester.

Formal application for graduation is necessary. For each degree or certificate, a separate application and fee are required. The graduation fee is \$15.00.

Questions concerning graduation should be directed to the Office of Admissions and Records. Students are encouraged to formally apply for graduation in the semester prior to graduation so that their files can be reviewed and any missing requirements determined in advance so that the students have an opportunity to plan to meet those deficiencies.

There is a \$5.00 late fee assessed for all applications submitted after the published deadlines.

High Honors/Honors

All students graduating from the Community College of Southern Nevada are considered for High Honors or Honors based upon their cumulative grade point average. High Honors requires a cumulative grade point average of 3.6. Honors requires a cumulative grade point average of 3.4. All honor students receive recognition on their diplomas, academic transcript, and, in the commencement program.

Immunization Policy

State of Nevada Revised Statutes require that students at high risk for vaccine preventable diseases are protected. The following list of Community College programs are potential candidates for this immunization policy, depending on the particular course: Criminal Justice/Fire Science (only with practicum); Dental Hygiene; Early Childhood Education; Emergency Medical Technician; Medical Lab Technician; Nursing; Physical Therapy Assistant, Occupational Therapy Assistant, Phlebotomy. All records, monitoring and questions regarding this requirement should be directed to the appropriate academic department level.

The following vaccines are the minimum requirements for students in these identified programs:
